- Getting families to volunteer continues to be an issue This year, there were approx. 90 open volunteer slots the week before the festival and many of the slots were filled by the Panther Creek High School Key Club members and a handful of families at Sterling – Maureen emphasized that events like this cannot continue to happen unless we have more family volunteer involvement and that this aspect needs to be addressed for community and safety concerns
